13	WHEREAS, due to social distancing requirements imposed during the
14	COVID-19 pandemic, the Court issued Order No. 20-8500-011 on April 21, 2020,
15	cancelling the large group swearing-in ceremony previously set for April 29, 2020,
16	for applicants to the New Mexico State Bar certified for admission by the New
17	Mexico Board of Bar Examiners;
18	WHEREAS, Order No. 20-8500-011 also provided an alternative method for
19	allowing applicants to the New Mexico State Bar to practice law under a New
20	Mexico law license without requiring an in-person ceremony until a large group
21	swearing-in ceremony could be rescheduled and held safely in light of the public
22	health concerns caused by the COVID-19 pandemic;

WHEREAS, due to continued public health concerns caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, applicants have been admitted to the New Mexico State Bar without a large group swearing-in ceremony since on or before April 21, 2020, through the present day;

WHEREAS, the Court permitted all such applicants to satisfy the in-person requirement to take the attorney's oath by returning a signed copy of the attorney's oath to the Clerk of Court;

WHEREAS, the Court notified all such applicants in writing that when public health conditions permit, they would be required to sign the Roll of Attorneys in person and to make travel arrangements as necessary;

WHEREAS, beginning in February of 2022, the Clerk of Court has been soliciting and scheduling appointments for attorneys admitted to the State Bar of New Mexico during the COVID-19 pandemic to sign the Roll of Attorneys at a mutually convenient location in Santa Fe or Albuquerque;

WHEREAS, a substantial number of the affected attorneys have not availed themselves of the opportunity to sign the Roll of Attorneys at a mutually convenient location; and

WHEREAS, the Court having considered the foregoing and being sufficiently advised, Chief Justice C. Shannon Bacon, Justice Michael E. Vigil, Justice David K. Thomson, Justice Julie J. Vargas, and Justice Briana H. Zamora concurring;

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the status of the law license of any active attorney admitted to the State Bar of New Mexico since April 21, 2020, shall remain active and unrestricted and shall not be affected by this order, subject to the following requirements:

- (1) Any attorney issued a law license since April 21, 2020, who has not signed the Roll of Attorneys **shall appear in-person** and **sign** the Roll of Attorneys at the Clerk's Office of the New Mexico Supreme Court, 237 Don Gaspar Ave. Santa Fe, New Mexico, which is open to the public from 8:00 a.m. to noon and 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, excluding legal holidays;
- (2) Failure to sign the Roll of Attorneys within one year of this order will result in the **immediate suspension** of the attorney's law license, and will require an updated character and fitness investigation and recertification by the Board of Bar Examiners for regular admission unless, upon a showing of extraordinary circumstances, the Court waives such requirements; and

(3) The one-year deadline set forth in this order shall not apply to present or future applicants who have not been admitted to the State Bar of New Mexico as of the date of this order.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
