decorum and to impose punitive sanctions for criminal contempt of court, see

WHEREAS, criminal contempt proceedings must comport with constitutional due process; and

WHEREAS, the Court having considered the foregoing and being sufficiently advised, Chief Justice Michael E. Vigil, Justice C. Shannon Bacon, Justice David K. Thomson, Justice Julie J. Vargas, and Justice Briana H. Zamora concurring;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Rules 1-093, 2-110, 3-110, 5-112, 6-111, 7-111, 8-110, and 10-169 NMRA are SUSPENDED until further order of the Court; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of the Court is authorized and directed to provide notice of the suspension of the above-referenced rules on the Supreme Court's public website and in the *Bar Bulletin* and by publishing the same in the *New Mexico Rules Annotated*.
