

1 **14-382. Assault; threat or menacing conduct with intent to commit a violent felony;**  
2 **“household member”; essential elements.**

3 For you to find the defendant guilty of assault with intent to [kill] [or]<sup>1</sup> [commit  
4 \_\_\_\_\_ ]<sup>2</sup> [as charged in Count \_\_\_\_\_ ],<sup>3</sup> the state must prove to your satisfaction  
5 beyond a reasonable doubt each of the following elements of the crime:

6 1. The defendant \_\_\_\_\_ (*describe unlawful act, threat, or menacing conduct*);

7 2. The defendant’s conduct caused \_\_\_\_\_ (*name of victim*) to believe the  
8 defendant was about to intrude on \_\_\_\_\_’s (*name of victim*) bodily integrity or personal

USE NOTES

20 1. Use only the applicable bracketed alternatives.

21 2. Insert the name of the felony or felonies in the disjunctive. This instruction is to be  
22 used for assault against a household member with intent to kill or to commit a violent felony, i.e.,  
23 mayhem, criminal sexual penetration, robbery, or burglary. The essential elements of the felony

1 or felonies must also be given immediately following this instruction. To instruct on the elements  
2 of an uncharged offense, UJI 14-140 NMRA must be used. For mayhem, *see* UJI 14-314 NMRA.  
3 For criminal sexual penetration in the first, second, or third degree, *see* UJI~~s~~ 14-941 [~~NMRA~~] to  
4 [~~UJI~~] 14-961 NMRA. For robbery, *see* UJI 14-1620 NMRA. For burglary, *see* UJI 14-1630  
5 NMRA.

6 3. Insert the count number if more than one count is charged.

7 4. If the “unlawfulness” of the act is in issue, add unlawfulness as an element as  
8 provided by Use Note 1 of UJI 14-132 NMRA. In addition, UJI 14-132 NMRA is given. If the  
9 issue of “lawfulness” involves self defense or defense of another, *see* UJI~~s~~ 14-5181 [~~NMRA~~] to  
10 [~~UJI~~] 14-5184 NMRA.

11 5. Definition of a household member should be given, *see* UJI 14-370 NMRA.
