I am writing as the Chief Judge of the Second Judicial District Court ("SJDC") and as a Judge in the Children's Court Division. The SJDC Children's Court Division consists of four (4) District Court Judges and three (3) hearing officers/special masters. The daily work of our judicial officers is almost exclusively in delinquency and abuse/neglect, and we are well-positioned to understand the practical effect of the proposed changes.

On behalf of the SJDC, we support the Children's Court Rules Committee's recommendations to modify the above-referenced rules and forms. We believe they provide clarity to practitioners and properly capture the legal requirements.
